

Official On-Line Source for California Articulation

Joint Resolution Endorsing ASSIST as California's Official Repository for Articulation and Transfer Information December 1998

Whereas the California Legislature encourages and supports collaboration and coordination among all segments of education in facilitating student progress from one segment to another, especially the transfer of students from California Community Colleges to California public four-year institutions, and;

Whereas the governing boards of the California public postsecondary education segments are directed to design, adopt, and implement policies intended to facilitate successful movement of students from California Community Colleges to the UC and CSU, and;

Whereas California's public postsecondary education segments have responded to these legislative and statutory requirements by developing ASSIST (Articulation System Stimulating Interinstitutional Student Transfer) to automate collecting and disseminating course articulation information for use by students, faculty, advisors and other staff, and;

Whereas all of the most current, official articulation that has been established among California public Community Colleges and universities is now in ASSIST and being maintained and updated actively by those institutions, and;

Whereas the ASSIST Board of Directors is currently working with the Association of Independent California Colleges and Universities to develop policies and practices to expand ASSIST to include articulation with independent California colleges and universities, and;

Whereas ASSIST is now universally available to all California students, faculty, advisors and staff via the World Wide Web;

Be it resolved that the leaders of the California Community College, California State University, and University of California systems along with the California Postsecondary Education Commission endorse ASSIST as California's official, statewide repository of articulation and transfer information.
